Basic Needs Hub:



The Basic Needs Hub is a great resource to support students who experience basic needs insecurity and help students thrive academically, pursue their career goals, and foster community relationships. The Western Hub of Living Essentials (WHOLE) Pantry is funded by student fees and individual donations. Located in VU 435 from 8:00am-5:00pm, the WHOLE pantry offers free food, toiletries, and even clothing. Other pantries are in Miller Hall 150H, Communications

Facility 257, Bond Hall 403, Arntzen Hall 510, Parks Hall 045, and the third floor of Fairhaven College. The Basic Needs Hub offers supportive and educational financial assistance through The Merriman Financial Literacy Program, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA), and short-term emergency housing and student emergency funds. The Basic Needs Hub is ready to meet you where you are and offers support of all kinds

The Miller Hall Heating Repair Project:

The heating system in Miller Hall is damaged and undergoing repairs. A temporary steam line has been installed, restoring heat until a permanent solution is implemented. As construction continues, East College Way will remain closed through the end of the fall quarter. The emergency vehicle access lane (marked by red tape in Red Square) should stay clear. University Budget Updates:



ASWWU is actively tracking the status of the university budget, cuts to funding, and reorganization efforts. The AS Executive Board voted 7-0 to establish a Budget Response Workgroup to advocate for more budget transparency at Western and communicate the impact cuts have had on students, faculty, and staff. The workgroup will write a letter to the President Randhawa outlining grievances with the cuts made over the summer, as well as write a detailed report on the impact on students and what input was considered in the decision.
