Bake Sale Guidelines

A temporary food establishment permit is **not** required for a nonprofit organization operating for religious, charitable, or educational purposes and selling **only** non-potentially hazardous baked goods. Some examples of **non**-potentially hazardous foods:

Cookies	Fudge and candy
Brownies	Fruit pies
Cupcakes	Cake
Muffins	Bread
Doughnuts	Scones

Examples of potentially hazardous foods that are **not** allowed in a bake sale are: cream filled desserts, lemon meringue pie, home canned foods, whipped cream, cream cheese, pumpkin pie, cheesecakes, and custard desserts.

Baked food items must not be prepared by ill persons and baked goods must not be touched with bare hands. Use utensils such as: tongs, spatulas, bakery papers or disposable plastic gloves to avoid bare hand contact with ready to eat foods.

Foods sold to the public must be protected from exposure to bacteria, virus and other sources of contamination. Foods must be pre-wrapped in a sanitary manner and wrapped in the quantities in which they will be sold. No self-service is allowed. All items on display should be protected from contamination. Use sneeze guards, plastic wrap, dome covers or foil.

The consumer must be informed by a clearly visible placard at the sales or service location that the foods are prepared in a kitchen that is not inspected by a regulatory authority. Example signage below:

B. NOISE

While classes or related activities are in session, no sound amplification, or other activities which might generate noise above the ambient level or otherwise interfere with the normal operation of the university shall be permitted in the proximity of classroom or office facilities.

C. FACILITIES OR GROUNDS

1. Outdoor art may be used only to the extent for which it was designed. No materials may be affixed to artwork.

Specific Activities Are Assigned to Specific Campus Areas

D. ACTIVITY RESPONSIBILITY

1. Responsibility for specific activities are assigned as follows. Such activities may not conflict with section A. through section C. above.
 - a. The sale of goods or services is restricted to the Viking Union Plaza and covered in a separate policy governing "The Sale of Goods and Services."
 - b. The scheduling of athletic field space shall be through the Office of Campus Recreation.
 - c. Assigned spaces, such as courts adjacent to Residence Halls, shall be scheduled by the department to which they are assigned.
