III. BUSINESS DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Kye Freeman stated that there is \$2,000 in Basic Funding, \$24,874.19 in Grants, Loans and Underwrites, \$4,780 in Club Conference, \$3,615 in Academic Conference, and \$1,305 in Bookstore Donations.

IV. CLUB RECOGNITION (*Basic Funding if Indicated*)

A. Saturn's Hoops

Kelsey Singer and Kim Butorac said that Saturn's Hoops is a dance and hula hoop club. Singer said they might be doing some fund raisers so they can go out and perform at events. The funding that they are asking for later in the meeting would be for supplies to make hula hoops for club member to use.

C. WWU Music Teachers National Association

Hannah Geneser and Kelly Huston explained that their club would be affiliated with the Bellingham Music Teachers Association. This club is geared towards people who want to be private music teachers rather than teach in schools. Huston explained that this club did exist a few years ago and want to be an AS club again. The club will be financially active and are planning on attending a conference in New York this spring. Eichholz asked if the club would provide opportunities for students to work with kids in a professional setting. Geneser said they would be providing mentorship opportunities and workshops.

Siemens explained that Minecraft is a single player/multiplayer game on the computer with buildable worlds. Eichholz asked how they would be financially active. Siemens said they may want to do fundraising for refreshments or something at a LAN party.

E. Ecosomatics Club

Shay Shapiro said this club geared towards students interested in the fields of Somatic Psychology and Eco-Psychology. Students in this area have expressed the need for extra space to practice, such as evaluating approaches within the fields. This club will mostly be discussion based group but they may bringing in speakers. Orallo-Molinaro confirmed that the club had a Fairhaven advisor. Temple asked what the field of somatic psychology entails. Shapiro explained that it deals with the nervous system and sensory information. This field uses movement instead of “talk-therapy” in order to heal.

V. **INFORMATION ITEMS**

A. WWU DECA

Spencer Mårtenson, Nick Maxwell, and Alex White explained that Collegiate DECA is a student business organization that allows practice with practical applications. Each group creates case studies and prepares presentations that they show to professionals. This organization is a way to get an upper hand on those they will compete with for jobs later on. The competitive events help students to simulate real life scenarios and enhance student professional development. There is also the

benefit of networking through DECA. WWU's DECA chapter started competing last year and the group has done very well. They want to be able to expand the number of students attending the international competition. DECA is also looking at having the state competition at Western next year. This will bring students from all over the state from other universities to Western which will greatly benefit all students. Currently DECA has 14 members who have shown interest in going to the state competition, 9 of which are underclassmen. The club members outlined the cost per person for the state competition: \$100 per person for registration, \$100 per person for 3 nights for 4 rooms, \$45 for travel, and approximately \$20 per day to cover food and other expenses for three and a half days. The club also has a sponsor, Natural Selection Farms, helping with some of the travel expenses. The club is willing to contribute approximately \$22 per person in order to save money for Nationals, which will be held in Salt Lake City, Utah. DECA is requesting \$2,100 from Activities Council to make sure everyone can go and have student costs be under \$100. Orallo-Molinari clarified that there were 14 people committed to going to the state competition. He also added that this year the council has only given out between \$75 and \$100 per person for conferences. Orallo-Molinari asked what other funding options the club would have. The club members said DECA would look into fund raising but they may have to have a larger student contribution or cut people who would otherwise be able to attend. Freeman clarified that this is an Academic Conference. Hayden added that if the total amount was granted the amount would total \$150 per person. Freeman explained that if the full amount was funded it would only leave \$1,515 in the Academic Conference budget for Winter and Spring Quarter. Orallo-Molinari mentioned the possibility of the remaining Basic Funding being relocated. Vonhoff said the budget can also be split between Club and Academic Conference budgets. Freeman agreed and said splitting would be a possibility. Eichholz asked if they had a vague idea on how much the club could fund raise. They weren't sure; maybe a couple hundred dollars. Koenig asked how much each person would be paying. The club members said it would be around \$98 per person on top of the \$45 dues they have already paid. Temple asked if the group will be coming back to ask for funding for their trip to Salt Lake City. They said they do foresee themselves coming back, however they will have a better opportunity to do fundraising. Hayden recommended that the council look back at the history of DECA requests from last year and look at out of pocket costs for the students.

B. Saturn's Hoops

Singer and Butorac are asking for \$65 in order to make hula hoops for members to practice hula hooping without buying their own equipment. This will allow for the club to make and decorate about 8 hoops and this will also be a club activity. Vonhoff reminded them that the hula hoops will club property. Freeman clarified the cost. Hayden asked if the supplies were going to be purchased locally, just in case they need a buffer from shipping. They said that this would not be necessary. Orallo-Molinari said that this can be made and action item because the request is under \$75.

Vni. OTHER BUSINESS

A. WWU Mock Trial

Milena Ull will be attending the regional mock trial competition at the University of Portland. They are requesting \$550, \$400 of which will go to paying for hotel rooms which will host 12 people (about \$80 per night for 3 rooms). The other \$150 would be for miscellaneous expenses. The club had some difficulties with funding earlier in the year where officers had to pay between \$45 and \$50 out of pocket for registration fees. Students will be paying about \$35 a person with the hotel rooms being funded by Activities Council. Vonhoff said she would like to see a budget including the miscellaneous costs. Hayden said that the council can't find "food." Ull asked if that could be put on the budget as registration. Hayden said this could be made up in travel, for example, that had not already been paid for like registration had. He also said the council is limited on funding for travel depending on different situations. Hayden said since there were issues in the beginning of the year the council would look at giving the group more because of this, not necessarily just adding extra money to one competition. Eichholz asked if this will come out of the Club Conference of Academic Conference budget. Vonhoff said it would come from Club Conference. Orallo-Molinaro asked for a revised budget for the meeting on January 9th and noted that the out of pocket cost would come out to about \$45 per person.

B. Orallo-Molinaro said this would be the last meeting of the quarter. He wanted council members to give feedback on how the council could improve. He also suggested looking at moving the time of Activities Council. Finally, the next meeting will be on January 9th.
