C. CSA Funding Request

Shirley So stated CSA was planning their 3rd annual Lunar New Year for January 27th from 6-8pm. However they were looking at doing it a little different this year. The biggest change, she said, is that the club will sell tickets: \$3 for students, \$5 for general admission. The event will also be more performance based this year with an intermission where people can eat. So said the club decided to charge in order to control the crowds as well as make money to pay back Steering's underwrite. So stated that if there is profit after paying back the underwrites they have received, the club wants to donate to Orbis, a third world flying eye hospital. There will also be a silent auction with baskets donated by officers and officer's parents. Nguyen asked why the club's request was so low. So stated that CSA had received funding from other sources and the event is not expensive to put on. Espinoza reminded the club that if they intend to donate to Orbis the club would have to fill out the necessary paperwork.

A. VSA Funding Request

Victoria Do said VSA is planning their 2nd Heritage Dinner for March 3rd. They are going to sell tickets -- \$8 for students and \$10 for general admission. The club is planning on having a Lion Dance and Martial Arts performances along with student groups. The club's theme is Our Soul, Our Roots, Our Land. Do said the club plans on donating proceeds to One Body Village, a group that combats the trafficking of women and children into sex slavery. They are also planning on having a fashion show with traditional Vietnamese attire. She said that the cost are a little higher this year. VSA is holding their event in Sehome High School and plan on renting a few extra tables. Do said the club is requesting \$4,960, but they estimated high to make sure costs are covered. The club has applied for funding from Willy Hart, the Diversity Fund, and RHA but have not heard back yet. Nguyen added that the club wants to make it a point to connect with community members outside of Western, so they chose Sehome High School because it is a bigger location where everyone can feel comfortable and welcome. Jaradi asked how much bigger Sehome is to the MPR. Do said it is twice as big.
