III. DISCUSSION ITEM

A. Russian Student Club

Dmitry Spiridonov did not come to the meeting so this item was removed from the agenda and future agendas indefinitely.

B. Weekly Concerns Series

Duot explained that the weekly series is a space where ESC members can come and talk about issues in the ESC and how they can be fixed or dealt with. Espinoza said that the times have changed a number of times so many people are confused about when these meetings will be. He suggested having these meetings announced in Presidents' Council. Espinoza said that when he attended there were about seven people in attendance. He said that during the meeting they discussed foul, lewd, and profane language; students feeling uncomfortable to come to the ESC; the professionalism of the Assistant Coordinators; and inappropriate language focused towards "white people". He said that the facilitator was Joanne DeMark and he found it strange that someone outside the ESC was leading the discussion. He said his concern was that they are not using the Presidents' Council to its full potential and said he would like them to come to a Presidents' Council meeting. The council agreed that it would be a good idea to have someone

from the office to come to Presidents' Council in an Advisory capacity. Duot pointed to the Charge & Charter of the council to look at why it was formed and the role of the members in the council. He said that they had an internal role within the ESC and would dialogue about any internal matters involving the ESC.

IV. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Building Unity Debrief

Duot brought up the idea of rewriting the ESC mission statement. He asked if this would fall under the purpose of the Presidents' Council. Espinoza said that it should. He explained that the leadership in the ESC has asked members if the mission statement is still relevant or if it should be changed to address the present needs of the organization, suggesting that it is not inviting enough and that the clubs have moved more towards an identity abroad focus. Espinoza said that he feels that the mission statement still rings true and it should represent underrepresented groups and is there for education and support. He said that he believes that the committee shouldn't have been created without discussing it with the Presidents. Manuel Hernandez said he isn't sure how it would be changed and that's mostly what he wants to know; what would the change and what would it be changed into. Nadia Saldana-Spiegle asked how many people joined the ESC because of the mission statement. Without an answer she continued to say that if the mission statement is updated and made more inclusive to "people who are overrepresented in some ways" it might seem like it's more open to allies. She thinks that the people they talk to and a friends with naturally, as an ally they will come to the ESC. She added that if they are a real ally they won't be afraid to come into the ESC. She said that there were two white people at building unity who are officers in their respective clubs, and if someone is going to be a real ally it won't matter what the mission statement says. She said that the ESC is not a space that is made for allies but for underrepresented groups and their allies. She said that there could be elaboration but there is not a lot of space for completely changing the entire mission statement. Shirley So said that when she joined ESC she did not look at the mission statement and that the name says that it's a safe space for underrepresented minorities. She said that while the mission statement might be old, it is the ESC's 20 years of representing underrepresented groups that makes it strong. She continued to say that as time changes it might be important to look at it and make changes to fit the times. She supported the idea of the committee. Espinoza said that the mission statement changes were brought up but it was decided against and the idea of a name change was brought up as well. Espinoza said that he thinks that the mission statement committee was rushed and that more people should have been consulted. So said that the committee wouldn't change things immediately but look at the statement and if they think there needs to be changes it will be discussed further and with more people. Espinoza said that he fears that since the committee was created the people on it could simply move forward with a change without consulting other people. Duot said that the Presidents' roles are to use their voice and educate their clubs about the issue and create an ongoing dialogue.

- A. Duot reminded the council that AS Jobs are opening next week.
- B. Hernandez asked if there was anything that could be done with Aramark and the contracts with catering. Duot said that there are discussions going on right now and Fabiola Mora has contacted them.
- C. Hernandez asked if this would be the last meeting of the quarter. Duot said that there would be a short house-keeping meeting with food next Monday.

- D. Serica said that some of her officers went to their monthly alliance meeting at WSU where the groups were sharing fundraising ideas. One idea that came up from UW was a Date Night auction where members are auctioned off. Some of the club's officers want to do this, but it has been brought up that this could bring up historical connotations of the slave trade. Serica said that before they plan the fund raiser she wanted to check in with clubs to make sure people would not be offended. She added that she personally thinks it is wrong but she is outnumbered in her executive board. Saldana-Spiegle said that no one should be putting monetary values on human beings, and it relates to the exploitation of people of color. This would also be based on looks which some people agreed is not a good basis for a fund raiser. Duot suggested doing something similar to what the Drag Show did by having the audience pay for people to get dressed in drag.
