Deng Duot, A.S. Vice President for Diversity, called the meeting to order at 5:10 p.m.

II. FINANCIAL REPORT-

Panelo said that he has been using Trello, which is an online service. He has been using it with clubs when it comes to heritage dinners. He said Queer People of Color (QPOC) and African Caribbean Club (ACC) have already used it. He said for everyone coming to Building Unity on Sunday, they will have breakfast and maybe a barbeque if the weather is nice. At Building Unity, they will be walking everyone through this program. He said there is a Heritage Dinner every single weekend this month. He then opened an excel sheet that provided a visual financial update which included all the events that have been, or are in the progress, of being held. He said Steering has roughly over \$6,000 left for the remaining events (including todays QPOC and ACC funding requests). Deng Duot said that the committee has been doing better than last year. He said he wants to know what was done this year that is different than last year. Panelo said there wasn't an advisor last year. He also added that he thinks this year they have set good goals, which have been met. Panelo said these numbers are just an estimate of how much we have in our accounts so that the committee can plan ahead easier.

IV. INFORMATION ITEMS - Steering Representatives

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A. ACC Heritage Dinner Funding Request

Daniel Jean'baptiste said they are asking for \$1,800. Their theme is "the Crown I Wear". They want to go beyond materialistic things about royalty. He then explained that it represents how African and Caribbean's are rooted in their cultural richness. The crown symbolizes the leaders who stood strong to discover their own royalty. He said it represents how they use that knowledge and power to make a difference and how they as individuals have their own identities along with that. He then explained how they use that knowledge and power as individuals to discover their own. Elisa Yihdego said that the crown also represents their struggles Represents struggles and family, and history. Metaphorically they all wear a crown. She then told the committee the breakdown of their budget sheet and how much each request is worth. Their event is April 27th from 6-9 pm, doors open at 5:30. Afterwards, they will be having a semi-formal dance celebration which will be from 10 pm-1:30 am. Panelo asked for ticket price. She said \$10 for students, \$15 for general admission. The dance is \$3 if you attended dinner, \$7 if you didn't. Duot asked about the general ticket price. Yihdego corrected herself and said the ticket price for general admission isn't \$15, but \$14. Duot asked what food they'll be having. She said they will have Ethiopian dip, black beans, cream puffs, salad, and sweet and spicy Caribbean cabbage. Duot asked if they have attained the Willy Hart co-sponsorship. Yihdego said yes. They co-sponsored \$1,200. Duot asked what they will do if they don't get the full amount from a co-sponsor. Yihdego said they may come back to Steering Committee if this happens. Duot said they encourage clubs to come back and ask for more from Steering if they don't get the full amount elsewhere.

B. <u>OPOC Heritage Dinner Funding Request</u>

River Reier said they're trying to go to a conference in Portland Oregon. 3rd annual conference. The theme is radical self-care in the decolonized mind, it's about taking care of yourself, and how you interact with the world. They said the budget is \$1122.13. It is split between registration and lodging. They said the total per person would be \$300 for 12 people. Lodging would be \$444, and they added that they received a discount. They're driving down on their own because there are no AS Vehicles available on the days they would need them. They said they have enough people to carpool. They said that they were hoping to get reimbursement. It's .44 per mile, which would be \$700. They said they will be spending Friday and Saturday night. They will have a speaker, then a dance. They will then have workshops the next day, a keynote speaker at lunch, and a musician. They said that workshops haven't been announced yet because they are still getting that organized. Nate Panelo asked how many people are going. They said they have done this budget on 12 people, but only 10 people may be going. Panelo asked if this will change the budget. They said that it would only be a \$70 difference. Duot said that's not a big difference. Duot asked the committee how they felt about this because this conference is on April 12th, which is coming up. He said that the rules of operation should only be suspended if there is a need. He said it should only happen so that everything else can be done in a timely manner. He said it's up to the committee. If they think it is okay, they can do it. If this would wait until next week, then it can. Ochoa said that it would only be fair because it was done for MEChA when it was also a last minute request. The committee agreed.
