Background & Context

Founded in 1969 as part of the National Chican@ Youth Conference, Movimiento Estudiantil Chican@* de Aztlán (MEChA) is the largest and oldest Chican@ organization in the United States. It is a student organization that promotes higher education, culture, and leadership. MEChA was founded on the principles of self-determination for the social and political liberation of our people. We believe that political involvement and education is the avenue for change in our society. The term Chican@ is grounded in a philosophy, not a nationality. Chicanismo does not exclude anyone, rather it includes those who acknowledge and work toward the betterment of La Raza.

Our chapter at Western Washington University has been active for about 30 years. Since than MEChA de WWU has fought for social justice here in the Whatcom, Skagit and Western community. From issues in education, farm workers rights, and systems of oppression. We strive to continue to create spaces for Chicanx that foster growth and instill pride in there identity.

Every year a National Conference for Mechistas is held. This year the conference will be held in Tuscon, Arizona at the University of Arizona and at the local Pueblo High School. The conference will be held on March 18,19, and 20th. In 2010 the state of Arizona banned Ethnic Studies (HB 2281). There will be workshops surrounding these issues and ways to work against systems of oppression in a university setting. During the conference there will be caucus spaces, an action, and keynote speakers that will share there best practices in meeting the needs of students of color. Students across the nation will be in Arizona in solidarity with Arizona and their fight against the banning of Ethnic Studies.

Summary of Proposal

The total cost for the entire conference is \$5,550 that includes travel, lodging, and meals. MEChA has been fundraising this conference since October. There will be 12 mechistas attending the conference. Attending the conference will bring new perspectives on community organizing, ethnic studies, and education to the mechistas here at Western. Mechistas here at Western work closely with Familias Unidas por la Justicia and high school students. Seniors juniors, sophomores, and freshman will be attending the conference. We all have been very active in our chapter by taking on leadership roles, organizing with FUJ on marches, organizing events on campus, partnering with other student groups on campus like Black Student Union, Social Issues Resource Center, Education Social Justice Minor, Ethnic Student Center, and plenty more.

The first stop will be in Las Vegas where the group will be visiting with Juan Espinosa who has visited Western and is also an alum of MEChA and will be practicing a traditional cleansing ceremony. They will then travel to Arizona for the conference and then travel to LA for the different cultural monuments.
