

Associated Students of Western Washington University Academic Support Committee Charge & Charter October 2016

I. CHARGE	 To serve as an advisory body to the AS VP for Academic Affairs on student issues and increase student involvement by: Discussing issues originating from the AS Board of Directors, other AS or University committees, within the Student Senatecommittee, or directly from students. Selecting and gathering input on an issue of the quarter pertaining to campus and/or community matters that impact students. Act as a representative on each constituent. Challenge their corresponding colleges about how departments are diversifying their programs. Focus on student academic success and figure outidentifV bottleneck issues within their corresponding colleges. Serve as a trial committee for the student senate and work with the AS Structural Review Committee on recommendations.
П. MEMBERSHIP	
	AS VP for Academic Affairs <u>, or designee (Chair)</u> 1 Senator per 1000 students (normal rounding rules) as follows: 1 Senator Representative to represent students in their First year at WWU 1 Senator to represent students in their Fourth year (and above) at WWU 2 RepresentativesSenators to representffom each of the 7 academic colleges and the graduate — school 1 Senator to represent the Residence Hall Association 1 Representative Senator to representffom the underrepresented studentsESC (to be appointed by ESC Presidents Council) Secretary (non-voting) Assistant Director of Student Activities. Advisor (non-voting)
HI. CHAIR	The Chairperson shall be the AS VP for Academic Affairs. They convene all meetings, approve develop agendas, and preside at all meetings. The Chairperson will also be responsible for making regular reports to the AS Board of Directors (at the AS Board of Directors' meetings) concerning the Senate's committee's position on any issue. The Chair will assist in organizing a program relating to the Issue of the Quarter. The Vice-Chairperson shall be appointed by the committee and acts in the absence of the Chairperson.
IV. MEETINGS	The <u>Student SenateAcademic Support Committee</u> will hold regular biweekly, meetings. Meetings may be called by any member with a minimum of 24 hours notice (voting or non-voting) when agreed upon by twenty-five percent (25%) of the seated voting membership.
V. VOTING	In order for a motion to pass, it must obtain a majority of the legal votes cast. An abstention shall not count as a legal vote cast.
VI. QUORUM	A majority of the voting membership shall constitute a quorum. If a quorum is not present, the Chair will adjourn the meeting and reschedule to a new day and hour.

VII. CONSTITUENCY	Each of the <u>Senators committee members representing a specific constituent</u> group of students (academic colleges, Graduate Schoofi, RHA, ESC) is responsible for representing the interests of that group. Each of the At large <u>Senators is assigned to the constituency of the general university population</u> and must act accordingly. Any method by which the <u>Senators members may</u> become better acquainted with the interests of their constituents is highly encouraged.
I. RULES OF OPERATION	The Senate committee may adopt and amend rules of operation governing its operation by a majority vote of the council, subject to review or approval by the AS Board of Directors.
П. AMENDMENTS	This Charter may be amended by a majority vote of the AS Board of Directors
III. REPORTAGE	This Senate committee shall report to the AS Board of Directors through the AS VP for Academic Affairs. No recommendation of th <u>is committeee Senate</u> is binding on the decisions of the AŞs Board of Directors.

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
