ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE BELLINGHAM STATE NORMAL SCHOOL

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS , that we . the under-
signed, OTTO FINLEY, VERNON LEATHA, TINVAL BRINKMAN, HENRY
LOWE and MILTON FLINT, being all citizens of the United
States of America and of the State of Washington, residents
of the City of Bellingham, County of Whatcom and State of
Washington, and being members of the unincorporated associa-
tion known as the Associated Students of the Bellingham
State Normal School, desire to incorporate ourselves under
the provision of the law of the State of Washington entitled
"An Act to provide for the Incorporation of Associations
for Social, Charitable and Educational Purposes", approved
March 11, 1895, do hereby agree and certify as follows, to
wit:

I.

The name of this corporation shall be "ASSOCIATED
STUDENTS OF THE BELLINGHAM STATE NORMAL SCHOOL".

II.

The purposes and objects for which this corporation
is formed are as follows:

1. To promote, manage, control and encourage all
kinds of field and athletic sports, and promote and encourage
the sport, pleasure, exercise and recreation of its members;
to arrange, promote, manage and control athletic contests,
and for this purpose to purchase, hold, acquire, buy, sell,
lease, mortgage and hypothecate both real and personal prop-
erty to erect buildings or other structures necessary and
proper for the purposes before mentioned.

2. To borrow and loan money and do any and all things whatsoever which may be requisite, necessary and proper in and about the carrying out of the purposes and objects hereinbefore mentioned.

3. To promote and encourage education and culture among the members of this corporation, and to this end to promote and encourage literary efforts of every kind, name, nature and description; to manage, promote and conduct educational and literary contests among members of this corporation, and between this corporation and other like bodies in this State and other States and in any foreign country.

4. To promote and encourage scientific study and investigation in all the sciences, and to this end to promote and encourage contests and exhibitions among members of this corporation, and between members of this corporation and other like bodies in this and in all other states, territories and countries.

5. To promote and encourage musical education and entertainments, and to this end to promote, and encourage musical entertainments and performances among members of this corporation and other like bodies in this State and in any other state, territory and country.

6. To promote and encourage debating and oratory, and to promote, manage and encourage any and all forms of student activities of the Bellingham State Normal School, and to this end to have power and authority to do any and all things which are necessary, convenient and incidental thereto.

7. To make and enter into contracts of every kind and character with individuals, firms, associations and corporations, private, public and municipal, and bodies politic, and with the Government of the United States, and with any State, Territory, District or Municipality thereof, and with

any foreign country.

8. To purchase, hold, acquire, buy, sell, lease, mortgage and hypothecate books, stationery, supplies, athletic and sport goods, wearing apparel, and any and all merchandise, the dealing in of which merchandise will be for the material benefit of the members of this corporation; to operate businesses and stores for the purpose of dealing in such merchandise; to borrow and loan money, and to do any and all things whatsoever which may be requisite, necessary and proper in and about the carrying out of the purposes and objects hereinbefore mentioned.

9. To do each and everything necessary, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or which shall at any time appear expedient for the protection or benefit of its members, either as holders of or interested in any property, it being the intention that the objects and purposes herein specified shall in no wise be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other clause of this or any other paragraph in this instrument, but that the objects, purposes and powers specified in each of the clauses of this second paragraph shall be regarded as individual objects, purposes and powers.

10. To hold real and personal property, and to hire, purchase or erect suitable buildings for the accommodation of the corporation to be devoted to the purposes set forth in this agreement of association, and to receive and hold in trust or otherwise sums received by gift or bequest to be devoted by it to such purposes, and for the purposes of this corporation to issue the promissory notes, bonds or other obligations of this corporation, to be secured by mort-

gage or otherwise upon its real and personal property in such manner as may seem best to effect the objects, intentions and purposes of the corporation, and as may be provided by the by-laws of the corporation.

III.

The principal place of business of this corporation shall be located at the Bellingham State Normal School in the City of Bellingham, County of Whatcom and State of Washington.

IV.

This corporation shall not have any capital stock.

V.

The time of the existence of this corporation shall be fifty (50) years from the date of its incorporation, unless sooner dissolved according to law.

VI.

All matters or things in any way appertaining to the affairs of this corporation where it has not been otherwise herein provided shall be subject to the regulation and control of the by-laws adopted by the members of this corporation.

VII.

All registered students who have paid the students' annual fee required by the Bellingham State Normal School, or this association, shall be members of this corporation during the term for which they are registered. Matters incidental to membership in this corporation and not herein provided for, shall be subject to the regulation and control of the corporation by the by-laws adopted by said corporation, and the rights and obligations of the members of this corporation shall be as prescribed by said by-laws.

VIII.

This corporation may and shall prescribe by its by-laws the manner in which and the officers and agents by whom the purposes of its incorporation may be carried out and the business of the corporation carried on.

IX.

The first meeting of the subscribers to this agreement of incorporation was held on the 21st day of September, A. B. 1933.



The undersigned, OTTO FINLEY, YERNO! LEATHA, TINYAL BRINKMAN, HENRY LOWE and MILTON FLINT, being all of the subscribers to the Articles of Incorporation, and all of the incorporators of ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE BELLINGHAM STATE NORMAL SCHOOL, a corporation, do hereby certify that the agreement for forming a corporation to be known as "ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE BELLINGHAM STATE NORMAL SCHOOL" hereto attached, is a true copy (one of the originals executed in triplicate) of that agreement and that the names of the subscribers are; Otto Finley, Yernon Leatha, Tinval Brinkman, Henry Lowe and Milton Flint, and that the date of the first meeting of the subscribers thereto was Thursday, September 21, 1933, and that each and every of said subscribers to said Articles of Incorporation was present and signed and executed a waiver of notice of such meeting, at which meeting of the subscribers to the said agreement of incorporation of the said Associated Students of the Bellingham State Normal School, an organization of said corporation was effected by the choice of a temporary secretary for the said meeting, and by the election of a president, secretary, treasurer and board of trustees, 'consisting of five (5) in number, and that no person was elected as an officer or trustee who had not subscribed to the agreement of incorporation herein. That said waiver of notice of meeting of the said incorporators has been

signed by each, and every of the said incorporators and that said notice has been recorded in the records of the corporation.

That Vernon Leatha was duly nominated and elected temporary secretary of said meeting.

That the following named persons were nominated and elected as trustees of said corporation: Otto Finley, Vernon Leatha, Tival Brinkman, Henry Lowe and Milton F. Flint, said trustees to serve as such trustees until the adoption of permanent by-laws of said corporation, and until successors to said trustees were duly elected and qualified under the terms of said by-laws of said corporation, and the determination therein of the terms of said trustees.

That the following officers were duly nominated and elected as officers of said corporation to serve as such officers until the adoption of permanent by-laws by said corporation, and until successors to said officers were duly elected and qualified under the terms of said by-laws of said corporation;

That a committee was appointed by the President, consisting of the following: Vernon Leatha, Tival Brinkman and Henry Lowe, and charged with the duty of drawing by-laws for the government of said corporation, and submitting the same to an adjourned meeting of the subscribers to the Articles of Incorporation of said corporation, said adjourned meeting to be held at the offices of Abrams, Healy & McCush, Suite 222 Bellingham National Bank Building, Bellingham, Whatcom County, Washington, on the 26th day of September, 1933, at the hour of two o'clock P. M.

That on said 26th day of September, 1933, at the hour of 2 o'clock P. M. , the adjourned meeting was called to order by the President, Otto Finley, in the offices of Abrams, Healy & McCush, Suite 222 Bellingham National Bank Building, Bellingham, Washington. That there were present at said meeting the said Otto Finley, Yernon Leatha, Tival Brinkman, Henry Lowe and Milton F. Flint.

That the committee on by-laws presented their report and presented therewith a set of by-laws. That said by-laws were read in full, and then read section by section, and were approved section by section, and approved in full, same consisting of twenty Articles, and after being approved were placed on the records of the corporation as the by-laws thereof.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the officers and trustees sign the Certificate, as required by sections 5 and 6, Chapter 158, Sessions Laws 1925, and that Mr. Tim Healy, as attorney for the corporation, be authorized to file same with the Secretary of State of the State of Washington, and the County Auditor of Whatcom County, Washington, paying the necessary filing fees, and that the corporation reimburse counsel for all moneys expended in its behalf.

It was further moved, seconded and carried that the matter of the transfer of the assets from the present Students Association to the Associated Students of the Bellingham State Normal School, a corporation, be taken up at an early meeting of the student body.

There being no further business to come before

the meeting, it was on motion adjourned.

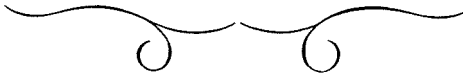

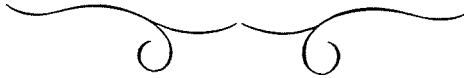

We the undersigned, as members of a fifteen (15) man board of Control, acting as the governing body of the Associated Students of Western Washington College of Education, request the State to amend our present Articles of Incorporation by striking out, "Associated Students of the Bellingham State Normal School", and inserting in its place, "ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF WESTERN WASHINGTON COLLEGE OF EDUCATION".

We believe the information in this letter to fulfill the provisions of Section 3883, Rem. Rev. Stat. Accompanying this letter is a check for the amount of \$7.45 for the filing fee as set forth in Section 3885, Rem. Rev. Stat.

In a general election held on April 29-30, 1952, the students of Western Washington College voted to adopt a revised constitution. Article II of the revised constitution states the name of this Association shall be "Associated Students of Western Washington College of Education". The vote on the revised constitution was three hundred and two (302) yes; to forty (40) no.

Pursuant to the provisions of RCW 24.03 of the Washington Nonprofit Corporation Act, the undersigned adopts the following articles of amendment to the articles of incorporation.

(1) The name of the corporation is Associated Student: <->f Western Washington State College

(2) The following amendment(s) to the articles of incorporation were (was) adopted on September 16, 1983 -

1. Amend the Articles of Incorporation as follows:

- a- -Change the name of the Association (Article I) to "Associated Students of Western Washington University."
- b, -Change the time of existence (Article V) from fifty (50) years to "perpetual."

Moved by Dan Pike, Seconded by Peter Ramsey VOTE: 9-0-0

The above action was taken in order to amend the Articles of Incorporation so that they are consistent with the bylaws of the Association which were approved by an 816-118 vote of the membership on April 14 S 15, 1981.

2. Amend the Board of Directors as follows: President - Dana Grant; Vice President - Ron Bensley; Vice President - Soren Ryherd; Vice President - Dan Pike; Secretary/Treasurer - Jon Sitkin; At-large - Gregg Sheheen; At-large - Peter Ramsey; At-large - Dana Wilson. Elected by membership on May 4 & 5 s May 12, 1983, in general and run-off elections, respectively. Address for all of the above is Associated Students of Western Washington University, Viking Union, Bellingham, Washington 98225. This will be a new Article X.

(3) Complete and/or check one of the following applicable statements:

September 16, 1983 was the date of the meeting of members at which the amendment was adopted. A quorum was present at the meeting and the amendment received at least two-thirds of the votes which members present or represented by proxy were entitled to cast.

The amendment was adopted by a consent in writing by all members entitled to vote thereto.

There are no members, or no members having voting rights. The amendment received the vote of a majority of directors in office at a meeting of the board held on _____.
