IV. Action items

A. WWU Hiking Club

Representative: Helen Krueger. Want to pay for additional transportation to hikes due to huge interest and limited access to transportation. Cook asked about the word kids in request. Krueger said that it is student only. Mouche asked about range of trips. Krueger said all within state. Onukwufor asked about the amount of money in their account and future plans to fundraise. Krueger said that they are planning but nothing is in motion yet. Goat mountain was suggested and there was agreement on moving in that direction. Mouche recommended relying more on self fund-raising. Onukwufor asked about funding from last year. Krueger said that all attendees paid a small amount for transportation, this request would lessen that burden. Onukwufor asked about mode of transportation planned. Krueger said they plan on using the motorpool but are open to other options. Rodriguez asked about how they plan on balancing interest earned at info fair versus on trips. Krueger said each trip will have a twenty person cap for logistical reasons. Onukwufor asked if upcoming winter will lessen interest in trip. Krueger said that this has not been the case in the past. Onukwufor suggests granting half the amount of the request. Rodriguez asks if gear purchased with this money will become personal gear or club gear. Krueger said that all gear will be club gear and re-used in future years, but funding is intended mostly for transportation. Van Druff suggests 500 dollars to encourage more involvement.

B. Quidditch Club

Representative: Abe Nurkiewicz. Funding is asked for upcoming tournament in Portland which is needed to qualify for regional tournaments. Tournament fee is 165 dollars and transportation costs is 210 dollars. Tournament attendance would encourage club participation, which is intended to bridge the gap between general student body and athletics. Rodriguez asked about funding need. Nurkiewicz said that this will be for future tournaments and to reimburse paid expenses within scope of organization. Reimbursement started now as they are training their budget authority. Harris asked about timeline of tournament. Nurkiewicz said that they will drive down the day before, stay the night, then drive back up the day of the tournament. Onukwufor asked about vehicle plans. Nurkiewicz said that they will be taking two cars. Onukwufor asks about the impact in WWU community. Nurkiewicz said that it creates a sense of sportsmanship and friendly competition in members which helps the community become more inclusive. Nurkiewicz says they will be back asking for the next tournament, but they plan on hosting at Western to save costs.

C. Large Event Opportunity Fund Request

Representative: Camilla Mejia. Funding is for ESC Conference this weekend to cover keynote speaker's honorarium. Cook asked about the lack of paperwork being turned in. Mejia said that this is a historic conference and will be used to pay someone who deserves it. Onukwufor asks about the amount requested. Mejia responds with 3600, other avenues have been attempted but denied. Mouche asked about funding available. Onukwufor said about 50,000 dollars. Cook asks how many students will be involved. Mejia says about 200, interest was such that they had to deny some applicants.

V. Information Items

A. Dead Parrot's Society

Representative: Mason Lok. Request of 6000 dollars will be to pay for improv teacher to run workshops and two performances available to within the club and without. They are paying the remainder of the cost. Harris asked about previous ticket sales. Lok said that this is to fundraise for future shows not for the week. Onukwufor asked about fundraising sources. Lok said it is done through ticket sales at previous shows, bake sales and special fundraising shows. Adams asks if week for workshops is ticketed. Lok did not know will have information for next week. Mouche asked if speaker will be returning this year. Lok said no this is a once a year event. Rodriguez asked how many people will be participating. Lok said each workshop is usually full. Around 20 people per workshop. Mouche asked what the lowest acceptable amount would be. Lok said he will discuss with club and return next week. Rodriguez asked what last year's grant amount was. Lok did not know will return with that info next week.

## B. Blue Crew

Representative: Alison Eddy. Funding will be to reactivate the student pep club, to increase student engagement in athletics, and help bridge the gap between athletics and the rest of the student populace. There are 110 people currently registered with that number growing. They will be purchasing promo items to increase excitement and interaction levels with the fans. This year's theme is "we are Vikings and this is Western." This request is an attempt to move financial burden away from athletics. Rodriguez asked if these are give-away items. Eddy said no they will be collected and re-used. Mouche asked about item durability. Eddy said while not incredibly high quality most items are durable. Harris asked if it was free to join the club. Eddy said yes and most members have territory passes which lets them come to games for free. Eddy said a poll was done to see what would increase interaction, results said a student area would be most preferred. Canvas sign is needed as NCAA rules prohibit paper signs on walls. Mouche asked about plans to approach clubs Eddy said that there will be greater effort to reach out and a form has been created to increase ease of access. Harris asked what a bluesuit is. Eddy said it is a spandex body suit. Harris asked about the gap in funding needed versus request. Eddy said the remainder will come from athletics and fundraising. Rodriguez asked about variance in the cost. Eddy said that they don't have numbers for how many things they are ordering so it changes, request will stay the same.
