Levi Eckman, Interim Senate Pro-Tempore, called the meeting to order at 6:35 PM

I. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

III. PUBLIC FORUM (*comments from students and the community*)

- A.** Lani Defiesta, incoming AS President, introduced herself and told the Senate that she and the rest of the incoming AS Executive Board was hoping to facilitate

a dialogue between the new Board and the Senate about building a strong relationship between the two bodies. Defiesta introduced herself as incoming AS President, Yesugen Battsengel introduced herself as incoming VP for Diversity, Trever Mullins introduced himself as incoming VP for Sustainability, Selome Zerai introduced herself as incoming VP for Activities, Grace Drechsel introduced herself as incoming VP for Governmental Affairs, and Barenburg introduced herself as incoming AS Student Senate Pro-Tempore. Phillip Hensyel stated that he believes that current Senators should provide considerable support to the incoming Senators to prevent work from being lost from year to year. Courtney Yoshiyama suggested holding regular meetings of the Student Senate and the Executive Board, as Tatum Buss had suggested to the current Board. Koltiska stated that it is important for the Executive Board to send academic concerns to the Senate when appropriate, in accordance with the new AS Constitution. Sarah Soulliere asked if the incoming Board had any specific ideas about maintaining a strong relationship between the Board and the Senate. Defiesta responded that the incoming Board had talked about trying to secure office space for Senators and asked if that is something the Senate wanted. Koltiska stated that tabling events with the Senate and the Board would be good for building relationships and reaching out to students. Hensyel expressed that informal get-togethers would be good for building a positive and closer relationships between the officials sitting on both bodies. Battsengel added that she hopes to collaborate with Colleges to address concerns of equitability in each College, as this is occurring across campus and could benefit from collaboration. Solomon added that it would be a good idea for Senators to have a mingling event with administration and incoming Senators. Koltiska stated that any current Senators still on campus next year should meet with the incoming Senators to provide additional resources and support to the Senate. Embly asked each incoming board member to provide a short description of what they hope to accomplish while in office. Battsengel stated that she hopes to focus on advertising the resources available on campus for marginalized communities. Defiesta added her hopes for transparency and accessibility with the campus community, Administration, Foundation, Alumni Association. Mullins stated that he believed it is important to establish support systems and sustainability and to have and create conversations concerning the issue of sustainability. Selome stated that she hopes to promote collaboration between the clubs, collect club data to ensure club activity and to rework club kick-off. Drecshel added that she hopes to get more people involved in LAC and focusing on issues such as college affordability. Barenburg stated that she hopes to get Extended Education involved in the Senate in some capacity, to have the Student Trustee more involved In the Senate, and to focus on safety on campus.

Millka Solomon talked to the Student Senate about what is going on in Faculty Senate and its discussion on the use of the N-word in the classroom, and asked the Senators to communicate with their constituents that Faculty Senate is moving slowly and is seemingly unwilling to ban the use of the N-word in the classroom. Hensyel asked why she thinks this is happening this way. Milkah responded that it seems like an unwillingness to outright ban the word's usage.

Yoshiyama asked if this problem is also in ECC. Milkah responded yes. Soulliere stated that Fairhaven College is planning on running their own changes to their by-laws and that other individual colleges could do the same thing. Solomon added that if they encourage their individual colleges to do this, to do it in a way that highlights the unnecessary nature of using the N-word in order to ensure people cannot make claims that this is a larger request than it is. Eckman added that this is a good time to be a bit more active in the pursuit of this issue, and to use the power of their positions in the discussion.

IV. INFORMATION ITEMS – Guests*

A. AS Wage Policy

Nate Jo, AS VP for Business and Operations, presented the AS Wage Policy proposal. Currently wages are made by taking the minimum wage by 3.5 and multiplying it by a percentage, which creates a larger gap between the top and the bottom wage as the base increases. The current model is unsustainable with upcoming minimum wage increases. The proposal is to add fixed number to WWU category minimums which will hold pay gaps to a constant amount. There are currently three options made by the Wage Task Force. Option A is recommended by the Wage Task Force and was passed by the Personnel Committee. The level matches the WWU category with the adjustment of wage. This represents the middle of the road option keeping the amounts similar, the big jumps are due to the jump in wage distinction level. Option B is the most fiscally conservative model and starts at \$13.50 which will be the minimum wage in 2020. Option C has higher wages and bigger budget impact starts at 14.00 an hour and goes up to 16.75. The budget implications are based on the average of wages ignore summer planning hours and irregular positions. If they do not change the structure it will cost \$1,163,000. Each option is less impactful, Option A is \$1,133,000, Option B is \$1,128,000 and Option C is \$1,142,000. They are hoping to pass a model to give to the Personnel office in time for the incoming positions. Yokuda clarified that these changes would begin following the current academic year. Soulliere asked why all three of the models represent a smaller budget. Jo responded that the budget implication decrease is a decrease from if they paid students next year using the current pay model. Soulliere asked about the reasoning for the different salaries for elected officials. Jo responded that the models being proposed are aimed toward compensating employees for the type of their work. Akelipa asked if there was a plan in place to adjust the flat amount as needed in the future. Jo responded that the policy will be reviewed every year by the Business Director and the Personnel Committee. Yoshiyama asked if there are any students on the committee discussing the wage. Nate Jo responded that personnel committee is entirely made up of students. Yoshiyama asked if Grad Students would be receiving an exception due to their pay scale supposed to be starting at 18 dollars an hour. Eckman stated that this is an ongoing conversation with Casey at the moment, and there is a stipulation that they can pay them less, though this is an ethical concern as well. Embly asked why AS employees would

be paid less for nine months of the year Jo responded that AS employees would be paid more under this policy than under any other policies. Schorr asked how much money was allocated from the Executive Board to the discretionary account. Jo responded that eight thousand dollars over three years for the Queer Guild Council, and \$19,550 per year for three years for the Blue Resource Center and if they fund all of these there would be over \$300,000 in the discretionary account and if met all commitments next year and did not put anything in the discretionary account this year and next year they would still have over 200,000 dollars. Noesen asked why the personnel committee recommended Option A over Option C. Koltiska responded that Option A is more likely to be approved by the Board and that option still pays more than minimum wage while having a smaller budget impact. Jo added that based on preliminary data, the AS has shifted to spending more on employment than services and Option C would continue this trend which would make it impossible to sustainably spend. Makrakis encouraged everyone to post comments online in order to facilitate better discussion and provide a less fractured recommendations.

B. Faculty Email Regarding Faculty Inappropriate Letter

Ballard stated that she was frustrated by an email sent by Sheila Webb to the Journalism Department specifically outlining the Western Front article about ACC, this feels like an attempt to silence students with public humiliation and callout culture as the reporter is called out by name in the email. Another email sent by Mcneel Jansen, the Faculty Senate President, sent to a specific Western Front staff student. Wood added that McNeel is the chair of ACC. Buss said that it is incredibly disheartening to see Faculty Senate consistently not taking the concerns of students into account. Yoshiyama asked if it would be possible to write a letter to show support for students. Yokuda confirmed it was possible for each senator to get copies of this letter as soon as they get permission from the student(s) affected. Hensyel stated that it might be good to get faculty involved in the statement. Eckman highlighted concerns regarding non-tenured faculty. Akelipa stated that this shows how difficult it is to advocate for students. Schorr asked if it would be of good use to identify the faculty senate representatives and have students speak to them directly. Koltiska will send an email with a list of a faculty senators. Eckman this email that leads to intimidation tactics is “really fucking inappropriate.” LeClair asked if there are means for students to take action against the professor. Eckman said they are looking into it and will give information as they find out. Schorr stated that there is a general mistrust with the Western Front from the faculty. Akelipa stated that it would be better if there is some conflict there to help the Western Front provide some oversight and criticism as needed. Schorr responded that there has been communication to not reveal information to the Western Front or they would cease speaking to them. Ballard stated that it may be another tactic to silence students. Eckman said that this year the Western Front has been working hard to rectify past mistakes and the reporter turnover makes things difficult for them.

Soulliere reported that she and Dayjha McMillan are revising the by-laws to include student votes and this will hopefully be voted on next week.

Graduate School

Schorr reported that Scholars Week went well and stated that the Graduate Council is rewriting its by-laws and included two positions for AS Student Senators on the council.

Huxley College of the Environment

Noesen reported that she and Embly were planning to host a forum on May 29th at 5PM in FR 100 regarding the issues students perceive within Huxley. Embly added that the previous forum was delayed due to concerns about the legality of the work environment in relation to the union contracts.
