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III. Discussion

a. Student Survey Draft

Minutes approved: 01/08/24

- **i** Godwin says that the council will send out an anonymous survey to ask WWU students to determine student policy priorities. The survey will be a google form. The survey will act like a ballot to give the LAC statistics which will be used to determine the main policy priorities for Lobby Day.
- **ii** The council discusses the issues with campus representation such as a low number of people-of-color on campus might lead to their issues not being considered a priority.
- **iii** Hayden states that the LAC is not bound by the survey results but rather uses them survey to weigh their LAC priorities.

iv Smith says that the survey could ask students to talk to the LAC about specific topics that the student prioritizes but that this would be optional and only for those willing to provide their email.

b. Post Secondary Basic Needs Coalition
