4/3/25 ASWWU Senate FY25 Budget Update Summary:

Presented by Adam Lorio, AS Gov Advisor.

ASWWU programs including ASWWU Government have been asked to revise/resubmit FY25 budget requests that are no more than 12% increase from what was approved/allocated for FY24.

The budget originally submitted AS Gov for FY25 that was shared previously was an approx. 55% increase from FY24 to budget for full weekly hours capacity for both AS Senate and AS Exec Board.

Full budget FY25 request for Senate: (Total AS Gov FY24+55%)

Senate President = 25 hrs/week For each of 20 Senators = 10 hrs/week 1 SGA 15hrs/week Includes training time, limited intersession work and planning time during summer. Total Senate FY25 Request: \$196,100

FY24 Allocation +12% Budget:

Senate President = 15 hrs/week For each of 20 Senators = 7 hrs/week 1 SGA 10 hrs/week Includes training time, limited intersession work and planning time during summer. Total Senate FY25 Request: \$143,322

FY24 Allocation +21% Budget

Senate President = 17 hrs/week For each of 20 Senators = 8 hrs/week 1 SGA 12 hrs/week Includes training time, limited intersession work and planning time during summer. Total Senate Revised Request: \$155,101

Notes:

AS Government Budget Allocation was decreased from FY23-FY24 by 14%

For FY24 we are on track to underspend our FY24 Allocation.
